Dear Local Official,

With a new and fast-starting two-year legislative session just underway, the Massachusetts Municipal Association is pleased to announce its Spring schedule for **Friday morning Legislative Breakfast meetings** in cities and towns across the Commonwealth beginning on March 1st.

We hope you can join us at a meeting near you and be part of a lively discussion with your legislators and MMA staff about state and local government in Massachusetts and important legislative and budget priorities for the upcoming year.

This round of nine meetings over three weeks will provide you with the latest information on the Governor's fiscal 2014 budget recommendation filed in January, including school and municipal aid accounts and his bold tax proposals, with an insider's view of what might happen the House and Senate. The meetings will also provide a great opportunity to talk with legislators and local government colleagues about plans to reform transportation finance in Massachusetts, including what it might mean for the Chapter 90 local road program – increasing Chapter 90 to \$300 million a year is a top MMA priority! In addition, the MMA will discuss the need to address the enormous unfunded liability for retired public employee health insurance benefits (OPEB), and MMA staff will be available to provide information on a wide range of issues impacting cities and towns, including local property taxes, zoning issues, and other questions you may have. We will also share the latest information on possible federal budget actions.

The breakfast meetings are timed to take place before the Legislature acts on local aid, taxes and transportation funding, so your conversations with legislators will have maximum impact. The sessions are structured to provide plenty of time for questions and answers, and an opportunity for local officials to talk about priority issues and challenges in their community.


