Hello Tim,

Most of what we need is actually in the original license. What would be most useful would be to install a meter on the line after the CG boathouse so we would have an idea of the amount of water being used by the town - so we are in agreement on this. I did not see in the current license a statement that it is understood by all that the CG shuts the water off during the winter months to avoid freezing/damage to the lines, it may be useful as you have suggested to make reference to an interruption in service clause. I am thinking of something like: "It is understood that water is supplied only seasonally and is shut down during cold months in order to prevent risk of freezing damage, and that should town's usage of the waterline adversely impact the station, its use will be ceased until it can be repaired/corrected or the emergency condition has passed."

I can prepare a supplemental License Agreement and send it to you if the above sounds appropriate.

Dear Georges:

We are nearing completion of the Menemsha Pier Connector today. We have all our construction done and will be energizing the power system tonight. God willing! Our water line is in place and ready to be connected.

I have been in contact with Station Menemsha and our contractor has apparently repaired the leak in the old boathouse water line. I watched the meter for 10 minutes the day we replaced the coupling and it didn't spin constantly anymore. The Chief checked it over night after the repair and said they used a total of 17 gallons. That was assumed to be a shower and a couple toilet flushes somewhere on station.

We are eager to connect a meter to the T in the line in our manhole and then connect the West/Filled Dock new waterline to that. The Menesha Water Company or the town/uscg could monitor the meter and have the town assessed for the water flowed through that meter and have the USCG Station Menemsha meter credited for the same number of gallons as often as the Water Comany does its billing.

We also understand that the entire station is fed from that meter. If at any time the town's usage of the waterline adversely impacts the station, its use will be ceased until it can be repaired/corrected and any injuries made whole. All this should be documented as an amendment to the license Chilmark issued to the USCG for the boathouse waterline. I welcome your comments or draft for the amendment.

May we connect to the waterline now?
