Southeastern Regional Homeland Security Advisory Council (SRAC) Regional Foam Trailers SOG

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Standard Operating Guideline (S.O.G.) is to establish a procedure to be used when the Regional Foam Trailer is required.

CRITERIA

When foam is needed for any fire or spill involving flammable or combustible liquids. It is discouraged to call this Foam Trailer for brush fires due to the cost of refilling, which will be the responsibility of the requesting department.

DEPLOYMENT

If a department is in need of foam support that exceeds their own department capabilities, they shall notify their Mutual Aid County Control. Mutual Aid County Control will immediately activate the closest two (2), [at a minimum], Foam Trailers to respond to the scene.

It is imperative that if the Incident Commander (IC) determines that the incident could escalate, the IC should request support as soon as possible. This will allow the host communities to deploy Regional Foam Trailers in a timely fashion.

The Regional Foam Trailer will respond with two (2) trained firefighters from the host communities.

When the Foam Trailer arrives on scene, the responding, trained firefighter's role will be to assist the Pump Operator by integrating the Foam Trailer within the firefighting operations.

If the host community requires additional Regional Foam Trailers response, they shall notify their Mutual Aid County Control to dispatch the next closest Regional Foam Trailer.

TRAILER CAPABILITIES

- > 500 gallons of Foam
- > 500 gallon polypropylene foam tank
- > Provides two (2) crosslays:
 - o 400' x 1.75" hose line, 60 gpm Foam Eductor for 1, 3, or 6% foam
 - o 200' x 1.75" hose line, 125 gpm Foam Eductor for 1, 3, or 6% foam
- > 500 gpm Foam Monitor
- > One (1), 35 gpm, gas-powered, electric-start pump
- > Honda generator with lighting

PUMP

The permanently-mounted pump is capable of pumping foam concentrate from the tank or from 55-gallon drums or 5 gallon pails and supplying it to a remote location, such as foam-consuming apparatus.

MAINTENANCE

If the Foam Trailer has been rendered out-of-service, the host community <u>shall</u> notify their Mutual Aid County Control of its status ASAP, as is normal department procedures.

The host community shall conduct weekly, monthly, and bi-annual Safety and Operation Checks, as well as maintain records of these checks. Copies of these records shall be maintained for a minimum of five (5) years.

STOCKING

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It is the financial responsibility of the department who had the incident to replace the foam stock with compatible foam for the regional foam trailer(s) utilized and or any other equipment that was utilized during the mutual aid incident. The acceptable time frame for restocking the utilized regional foam trailer(s) shall not exceed a period of seventy-two (72) hours and or three (3) days. The trailer will be resupplied at the counties foam cache locations. (See below)

The department who requested the foam is also responsible for seeking payment from the responsible party related to the regional foam trailer incident. It is not the responsibility of the regional foam trailer host or foam bank host to provide payment to restock foam utilized during a mutual aid response.

The receiving department shall cooperate with the department that delivers the foam trailer to recover all reasonable and necessary costs when a "responsible party" is identified.

The host communities shall, immediately, prepare costs incurred for labor and materials used for the incident.
