## Minutes

July 15, 2020, via zoom 5pm

<u>**Chilmark Road Race</u>**: Hugh Weisman described the planned registration and "virtual" race process. He reported that there are already 1,550 entries, with roughly one third indicating that they wish to run the Middle Road course, and plan to pick up their packet at the Community Center. The race is spaced out to take place over four days, and the volume appears to be manageable without creating a formal run schedule.</u>

Packets will be distributed over a three-day period, with two people handing out packets at a rate of 20 per hour. The board confirmed that there will be no shuttle to get people to the starting line, and felt satisfied with the proposed plan.

<u>Gourley, 240 Middle Road (19-70)</u> Reid Silva presented a proposed upgrade for a failed system. The leach field envelope is constrained by well locations and the pond. The system will use Schedule 40 components under the driveway. The Board **approved** the proposed upgrade. <u>Phase 3, Step 1 for Softball, Yard Sale, Beach</u>: The Board reviewed conditions for softball in the field, Yard Sales and Beach under the newly-announced Phase 3, step 1 Massachusetts Reopening Plan.

**BOH work plan for rest of summer**: the Board asked Marina Lent to provide occasional updates for the Board, rather than sending an endless ongoing stream of emails without commentary or analysis. Jan Buhrman asked for agenda annotations in advance of Board meetings that analyze the issues for each item. Matt asked for continued and reliable service to the Board in getting the day to day parts of the job done, and maintaining continuity of service, including tasks like minutes, food permits, etc. rather than fading out and falling behind on these types of tasks.

<u>Minutes</u>: The Board approved minutes for meetings dating back to April, and asked Marina Lent to have then posted on the Town website's BOH web page.
