Dukes County Winter Weather Advisory

WEATHER REPORT FROM NWS BOSTON/MEMA:

A dangerous arctic blast is due this weekend. Northwest wind gusts of 40-45 MPH are expected Friday into Saturday with wind chills as low as 20°. The combination of below zero air temperatures and blustery conditions will lead to "feels-like" temps near -20° for many areas by Saturday morning. Dukes County Emergency Management Association is closely monitoring the impending weather and is coordinating with our community partners and local/state officials.

CONSIDERATIONS:

- Frostbite and hypothermia can occur in less than 10 minutes if precautions are not taken
- Any power outages would be a concern given the extreme cold
- Mechanical systems like heating systems and vehicles may be adversely affected

PREPARATION/SAFETY TIPS:

- For Yourself:
 - o Stay home and indoors whenever possible
 - o Limit your time spent out in the cold
 - o Bundle up in lightweight warm layers that covers all exposed skin
 - Stay dry/avoid sweating if outside
 - o Go grocery shopping before the weather gets bad
 - o Charge all electronic devices
 - o Check on family, friends, and neighbors
- For Your Pets:
 - o Limit their time spent out in the cold
 - Keep outdoor pets inside
 - Cover and check their paws/hooves
 - o Check their water and food supply
- For Your Car:
 - Keep your gas tank at least half full
 - Maintain tire pressure
 - o Notify family and/or friends if traveling
 - o Drive slow and keep your distance
 - o Pack an emergency supply kit (jumper cables, ice scraper, flashlight, shovel, blankets, first aid kit, water, food, etc.)

- For Your Residence:
 - o Keep your residence heated to a minimum of 65°
 - o Close blinds, curtains, and room doors
 - o Slow drip all faucets
 - Open cabinet doors near pipes
 - o Check your fuel oil levels
 - o Know the location of the main water shutoff and turn off outside water
 - Use caution with indoor heaters
 - Check that furnaces, fireplaces, wood stoves and electric heaters are working properly
 - Make sure there are no flammable items within 3 feet
 - Keep your fireplace flue closed when you're not using it
 - Plug space heaters directly into wall outlets (no extension cords) on a flat, solid surface (not on carpet) and unplug when not in use
 - o Make sure smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms are working
 - o Caulk/weather-strip windows and doors to keep cold out
 - o Keep generators outside and at least 20 feet away from buildings
 - O Ask a neighbor or caretaker to check on your house if you're away
- If There's a Problem:
 - Act quickly to minimize damage
 - o Dial 9-1-1 for all emergencies
 - o If your pipes are frozen, thaw them immediately or call a plumber
 - o If your pipes burst, turn off the water, attend to the mess and properly dry/repair any water damage
 - o If you lose power, go to your nearest warming shelter
