At the close of voter registration on May 19, 2020 there were nine hundred and eighty-two (982) registered voters in the Town of Chilmark. With eighty-four (84) voters present at the Annual Town Meeting, approximately 9% of the total number of registered voters, the Moderator called the meeting to order at 5:31p.m., on the outdoor basketball court at the Chilmark Community Center at 520 South Road. The evening was sunny, breezy and about 70 degrees F in temperature. Constable Marshall E. Carroll, III attested to the posting of the warrant.

The Moderator postponed action on Article 1 until June 10, 2020 at 12:00 noon.

ARTICLE 2. To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees and act thereon.

The Moderator read Article 2 and inquired if there were any Town Officers or members of Committees who wished to present a report. No reports were offered.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to raise such sums of money as will be necessary to defray town charges and to make the appropriations for the ensuing year, as printed under Departmental Budgets - Salaries and Expenses totals, and that the amount set forth under the Community Preservation Committee (Dept. 179) shall be funded from the Community Preservation FY2021 Budgeted Reserve Fund Balance.

Recommended by the Finance Advisory Committee - 6 Ayes - 0 Nays - 1 Absent

The Moderator read Article 3. The Article was moved and seconded. The Moderator asked the voters if he should read the printed budget. The voters said no. The Moderator asked if there was any discussion on Article 3. Tim Carroll was recognized and offered an amendment. Mr. Carroll proposed to amend the article to reduce the FY2021 proposed MVRHS District Assessment budget amount from \$1,038,490.79 to \$1,028,577.61 for a total reduction in this line of \$9,913.18. The amendment was moved and seconded. The Moderator read Article 3. as amended. The Moderator asked if there was any discussion. There was no discussion. The Moderator brought the amendment to a vote. The amendment was passed unanimously. Mr. Carroll was again recognized and further proposed to amend Article 3 to reduce the FY2021 proposed Up-Island District Assessment budget amount from \$2,603,471.89 to \$2,597,975.41 for a total reduction in this line of \$5,496.48. The amendment was moved and seconded. The Moderator read Article 3, as amended. The Moderator asked if there was any discussion. There was no discussion. The Moderator brought the amendment to a vote. The amendment was passed unanimously. The Moderator read Article 3, as amended. It was moved and seconded. The Moderator asked if there was any more discussion. There was no more discussion. The Moderator brought Article 3, as amended, to a vote.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to transfer from available funds in the treasury the sum of \$280,000.00 to the town's stabilizations funds as follows:

\$130,000.00 to be placed in the General Stabilization Fund,

\$25,000.00 to be placed in the Fire Department Stabilization Fund, with the intent that it be put towards the replacement costs for fire apparatus which is over twenty-five (25) years in age,

\$25,000.00 to be placed in the Police Vehicle Stabilization Fund,

\$100,000.00 to be placed in the Highway Stabilization Fund.

Building Trades, including without limitation design, engineering, installation, and any other costs incidental and relative thereto, provided, however, that this appropriation shall not be effective unless each of the other member Towns of the District approve a corresponding appropriation for their respective share of the total project costs; further provided that this appropriation be contingent on the approval of a Proposition 2½ capital outlay expenditure exclusion under General Laws Chapter 59, § 21C(i½), or to take any other action relative thereto.

 - \$8,624.00 to fund the CORE program under the supervision of the Up Island Council on Aging.
 - \$12,057.00, as the Town's proportionate share of the Fiscal Year 2021 cost to fund the Healthy Aging Martha's Vineyard for planning, community building and advocacy work for all Island elders, based on the "50/50" formula.
 - \$3,234.00, as the Town's proportionate share of the Fiscal Year 2021 cost to fund the **Dukes County Substance Use Disorder** prevention programs, based on the "50/50" formula.
 - \$3,374.00, as the Town's proportionate share of the Fiscal Year 2021 cost to fund the Healthy Aging Task Force FIRST STOP, based on the "50/50" formula.

- ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to approve the following four requests of the Community Preservation Committee:
 - (1) To see if the Town will vote to reserve from the Community Preservation Fund FY 2021 estimated annual revenues up to the following amounts for community preservation projects: \$36,000.00 for the Community Preservation Reserve for Open Space; \$36,000.00 for the Community Preservation Reserve for Historic Resources; \$36,000.00 for the Community Preservation Reserve for Community Housing; and \$252,000.00 for the Community Preservation Budget Reserve.
 - (2) To see if the Town will vote to approve the following request of the Community Preservation Committee: To see if the Town will vote to approve the following request of the Community Preservation Committee: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the existing Community Preservation Reserve for Open Space and park and recreation use the sum of \$25,000.00 to the Field Fund, Inc. for the purpose of restoring the baseball field at the Chilmark School. The final installation and maintenance plan shall be approved by the Chilmark Community Center Advisory Committee and Board of Selectmen before any work begins.
 - (3) To see if the Town will vote to approve the following request of the Community Preservation Committee: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the FY 2021 Community Preservation Reserve for Community Housing the sum of \$50,000.00 as Chilmark's share toward the acquisition of future housing for homeless residents earning up to approximately 30 percent county median income. The horne will be purchased by the Island Housing Trust and leased to Harbor Homes of Martha's Vineyard, Inc. for its exclusive use to serve homeless

individuals. The funds shall not be released until a closing date is scheduled for the property. An appropriate affordable housing deed restriction shall also be filed with the deed to the property. If the property is sold or its use changes, 100 percent of the funds shall be reimbursed to the Town of Chilmark Community Preservation Reserve for Community Housing. If the Town has repealed the CPA the funds shall be reimbursed to the Town's Molly Flender Affordable Housing Trust. To fund this request \$50,000 will be transferred from the Community Preservation Undesignated Fund to the Community Preservation Reserve for Community Housing.

(4) To see if the Town will vote to reserve from the Community Preservation Fund FY 2019 estimated annual revenues up to the following additional amounts for community preservation projects: \$6,449.00 for the Community Preservation Reserve for Open Space; \$6,449.00 for the Community Preservation Reserve for Historic Resources; \$6,449.00 for the Community Preservation Reserve for Community Housing. Our state matching amount was slightly higher than estimated and budgeted. This will bring the total FY 2019 reserve amounts to the minimum 10 percent of total FY 2019 CPA revenue as required by the Community Preservation Act.
